
2. Which of the following best defines your housing status in Tolono?





26. Would you support the creation of railroad "Quiet Zones" throughout the Village of Tolono?


A "Quiet Zone" is a stretch of at least a mile and a half that may have several public grade crossings at which train horns are not routinely sounded.

Trains must sound their horns if something is on the tracks or they are transporting dangerous cargo, regardless of the quiet zone.

Trains must be permitted to sound the horn if a car, human, animal, or other objects are on tracks.

This would include upgrading crossing arms, adding security bollards (vertical posts of iron fixed to the ground) and islands that prevent vehicles from driving around gates.
